This kit quilt was made appliquéd by Betty Ann Amos Baugh in the 1940s when the quilter was living in the first house in Williamson County, built of logs by the McEwen family. Under the tin roof you could still see the shake shingles. She owned this property adjoining a farm called Aspen Grove, which is now the Vanderbilt Legends Golf Course. The antebellum home is now the Golf House Tennessee. The family also owned adjoining lands where much of the Cool Springs area is now located. She gave it to me in 1993 and I used it everyday for many years; hence the frayed condition since I was young and foolish and put it in the washer and dryer repeatedly.

The quilting was done by Mrs. Maupin, wife of a farm hand at Aspen Grove. She was one of 22 children.
